Learn genealogy research methods and resources for family history research to find fascinating ancestors from Scotland and Northern Ireland, including these peoples' history of migration to North America. Presented by Jean Roth of the Seattle Genealogical Society and Irish Heritage Club.

2:30- 3:15 pm What? There are Six Celtic Languages?

Yes, there are! And this team presentation will introduce you to all six: Gaelic, Irish, Manx, Welsh, Cornish and Breton. You will hear what they have in common, how they're different, and where they stand in the world today. All six languages will be spoken in conversation today.

3:30-4:15 pm Introduction to Scottish Mythology and Folklore.

Storytelling forms an important part of traditional culture in Gaelic Scotland.
